We had our first **club buoy race** and it was as exciting as the photo finish of the KY Derby. Just ask Chuck and Mark!


The **Sunfish** are sailing on Tuesday evening. Contact Dominic Keim **dominic.v.keim@gmail.com** for information.



UPDATE ON CRSA CRUISES: FRENCH RIVIERA AND USVI

The French Riviera Cruise

This cruise currently has one cabin available.

Thirty-two people will be sailing on four big Monohulls for twelve days from September 28th to October 10th 2024.

We will start and finish the adventure at Port Pin Rolland near the town of Toulon. We plan to sail to Saint Tropez and Cannes and will have many stops in between.

The cost is \$720.00 per person based on double occupancy.

A deposit of \$500 per person is required to book this cabin.

The price covers all boat expenses.

Ground transportation, airfare, lodging and food are not included.
As always, CRSA recommends trip insurance.

The US Virgin Islands Cruise

This cruise currently has three boats full and one cabin left on the fourth boat.

The dates are January 4th to 11th, 2025.

We are sailing on large Premier Catamarans.

The cost for this trip is \$1,510.00 per person based on double occupancy.

A deposit of \$500 per person is required to book this cabin.

As above, this price covers all boat expenses.

Ground transportation, airfare, lodging and food are not included.

The 2024 radio sailing race series is underway!

On May 1st ten boats were in the water at Lakeshore Village to participate in a "fun sail" and practicing for the upcoming official race dates. The winds were light, but it proved to be a successful first outing. The new GPS controlled racing mark performed beautifully. The mark was purchased unassembled, as this reduced the price to the club, and CRSA member Lewis Gardner completed the assembly with some improvements on the design. The benefit to the GPS mark is it can be located anywhere we choose and there are no fishlines to get snagged on our keels.

Our first official race was held May 8th. Unfortunately, the weather forecast kept many of us from participating, but five members made it to Lakeshore Village and completed four races. We had a club first that night as Merritt Wade won all four of the races!

Our fleet is growing with 12 members having Dragon Force 65 boats. The club also has a boat for members who may be interested and would like to give radio sailing a try. You will be surprised to find it is very similar to sailing on a larger boat, except you don't get seasick or rope burns on your hands.

We race every Wednesday at 6:00 PM at either Lakeshore Village or Jacobson Park.

Let's Go Sailing, for Women, by Women

Welcome to summer 2024 Let's Go Sailing, for women by women is alive and well! If you have not participated in the past, no worries. When your schedule permits, you are always welcome!

We have eight and three-quarter skippers! When we started, there were three: **Donna Leslie**, **Liz Harris and me**. Over the last year **Nicole Brocato**, **Shelby Bryant**, **Karen Cole**, **Beverly Hale**, **and Charmaine Pfister** have completed ASA101 and help skippering on our water days. **Cheryl Baker** has completed the ASA101 water component, then ran into some scheduling conflicts and will be completing the written test soon.

We typically plan land activities until the weather breaks and this year is no different. Beginning with safety in January, moving to a great motor clinic in February, and a session with Kentucky Fish and Wildlife on backing boat trailers and launching boats in March. Our first water day was April 29, shifted from the 30th due to crazy Kentucky weather.

On March 28 Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Officers **Tim Brett and Andy Amburgey** met us at Scott Creek Marina and spent the day teaching us how to back trailers safely and with more confidence! We started the day going over the trailer and learning to check the bearings, discussing grease guns, balls and hitches, trailer lights and hooking and unhooking the trailer from the vehicle. Once we had a strong understanding of the trailer, it was practice time! Each of us, with the coaching provided by Officer Brett and Officer Amburgey backed our trailers, including a sunfish trailer (which we know is one of the hardest trailers to back), down the Scott Creek ramp in preparation to launch. As a recap and for those who could not attend, three tips stood out:

- 1. Your side mirrors are your best friend!
- 2. With your hands at the top of the wheel and as you back the trailer, when you see the trailer in the right mirror, turn the wheel to the right and vice versa.
- 3. When backing a trailer, "slow is smooth and smooth is fast!"

A special thank you again to Officers Brett and Amburgey! We are much more confident after your very patient coaching approach!













As mentioned earlier, our April 30 date was shifted to April 29 and there was a total of eight women and two boats. First, a big thank you to **Liz Harris** for taking the lead organizing the session and congratulations to **Charmaine Pfister**, as she skippered their boat, Capricious, for the first time on an LCS outing!

That's My Boat

Each edition of the MainSHEET will feature a boat profile of a CRSA member.

Chuck Emrich, tell us about your boat!

Sailing with Chuck Emrich or... What happens if you get scared half to death twice?

Drifting down the Ohio River in a small cabin cruiser on a hot July day with no idea of how to sail was my first experience of sailing during high school. Next was renting a Hobie Cat in early college, which I sailed backwards most of the time! My next exposure was sailing lessons at Lake Geneva, WI, in 1989 – with no passion. But the next year, as an "intermediate sailor" I lost my heart to the love of sailing!!! Later that summer, after looking at many boats, I bought a Catalina 22 for the family and envisioned that sailing would be a great activity with all. My first wife loved the water but liked reading and sun tanning more. The kids and I went every weekend with diaper bags in tow (Sierra was only 6 months old). It was great fun and I found Cave Run Sailing Association and joined!

Someone said that if you want to be a better sailor, you should race. That is where my love of the wind and water really came together! Always last, I held up the next race – getting

finished in place was my usual!

Going off-lake to regattas was my next level of improvement: updating my boat with new sails, a smooth bottom, different sailing conditions, and learning through mentors how the rules work. It was a new obsession - just like an addiction to drugs and about the same cost! I did 12-15 regatta nationals, which included driving 20,000 miles in the year to find competition. You must be aggressive to advance in tighter competition, with the adrenaline and testosterone flowing! And now I know there is a better way to stay out of trouble – by looking at what will happen shortly and taking action to avoid it! Ah, the wisdom of being older!



Through our sister organization – the power squadron – I took their courses through advanced piloting. I later became a master inland Coast Guard captain. For the last 15 years, I also owned a 38-foot vessel. It was a true Blue Water Boat. I learned coastal cruising, traveling many thousands of miles at sea, and exploring new cultures of the islands. It became another passion, complimenting my racing interest. The memories and creating lore made it all worthwhile for me! That story ended in the Bahamas this year, with hitting a coral head. We lost everything that day! The tragedy could have been prevented by the captain, but nevertheless, I lost my boat. If only I had done this or that, but reversing time does not work. Since then, the adventure continues, but maybe through our cruising program, instead of boat ownership. The story will continue because the passion is still there! How many more years do I have? I've always said to myself "wheel me down to the ship and give me the tiller or wheel and shove me off!!!"

My love of passing this sport on to younger sailors is now a very strong interest. I know what sailing means to me and I work to give that opportunity to all interested sailors!

If ever I can be of assistance to you with a sailing problem, I am there to help you! And if you have the love of sailing, why not get involved in more activities – especially Youth Sailing!!!!
